Memo Homescreen

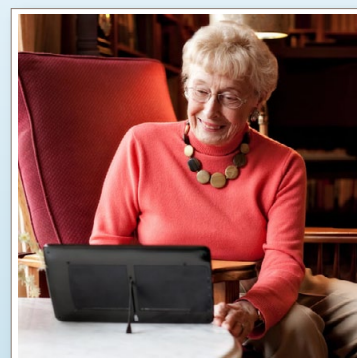
Check the options you want to display on the Memo homescreen: SAVE

- Date & Time
- Crawl Line
- Today's Schedule
- To Do Today

Check the additional features you want to display:

- Weather
- Pill Box
- Emergency
- Phone Book
- Photo Albums

Changes made through the website will appear on your Memo device within 10 minutes of saving.



Family members and care professionals must balance caregiving with many other everyday responsibilities.

A website provides a single point where caregivers can add and update important information such as appointments, to dos and reminders, at any time, from anywhere they have internet access.

The information instantly and automatically appears on the Memo device—the Memo recipient needs no computer knowledge to use it.

Remind. Repeat. Reassure.

The Memo sits out in plain sight, on a kitchen table or next to a favorite chair.

The Memo recipient needs no computer knowledge, because the Memo receives messages and information instantly and automatically from a caregiver website.

Multiple caregivers (sons, daughters, aides, therapists) can securely access the Memo caregiver website to see exactly what the Memo recipient sees and update information at any time, from anywhere they have internet access.

Memo replaces the often confusing and chaotic system of quickly-outdated sticky notes, lists, and calendars that elders typically rely on.



Memo requires...

- An internet connection in the Memo recipient's home (DSL, cable, or 3G tethering; a wireless router is strongly recommended)
- Purchase of a 10" pre-programmed device (can be reactivated and used as a tablet PC if and when you decide the Memo isn't right for you)
- A monthly or annual subscription to the Memo caregiver website
